

Articles of Association for Global Art Copenhagen

§1. Name and Registered Office

1. The name of the association is Global Art Copenhagen.
2. The association's registered office is the Municipality of Copenhagen.

§2. Purpose

The purpose of the association is to promote cultural exchange and understanding through drama, music, and performing arts.

The association particularly works to integrate international artists and participants into Copenhagen's cultural environment.

§3. Membership

1. Any individual who supports the purpose of the association may become a member.
2. The membership fee is determined by the General Assembly.
3. Resignation must be submitted in writing to the Board.

§4. Activities

The association may organise, among other activities:

- International theatre and music workshops
- Collaborative projects between local and international artists
- Cultural events, concerts, and stage performances
- Instruction and courses in drama, music, and cultural traditions
- Networking meetings, seminars, and festivals focusing on global cultural understanding

§5. General Assembly

1. The General Assembly is the highest authority of the association.
2. The ordinary General Assembly is held once a year and must be convened with at least 14 days' notice.
3. Proposals to be considered must be submitted to the Board no later than 7 days before the General Assembly.
4. The agenda must include at least the following items:
 1. Election of a chairperson of the meeting

2. Report from the Board
3. Presentation of accounts and budget
4. Incoming proposals
5. Election of the Board
6. Any other business

§6. Extraordinary General Assembly

An extraordinary General Assembly may be convened by the Board or when at least one-third of the members request it in writing.

§7. The Board

1. The Board consists of a minimum of three members: a Chairperson, a Treasurer, and one ordinary member.
2. Board members are elected for a term of one year.
3. The Board is responsible for the daily management of the association and represents the association externally.

§8. Finance and Accounts

1. The financial year follows the calendar year.
2. The accounts must be approved by the General Assembly.
3. The association's funds may only be used in accordance with its purpose.
4. The association is liable only for its own assets. No personal liability is incurred by the members.

§9. Amendments to the Articles

Amendments to the Articles of Association require a two-thirds majority at a General Assembly.

§10. Dissolution

1. Dissolution of the association requires a two-thirds majority at two consecutive General Assemblies.
2. In the event of dissolution, any remaining funds shall be allocated to a non-profit purpose decided by the General Assembly.
